GOOFUS (GH897)

Lilly and Porky came to us as fosters at the beginning of August, 2014. They had neither had collars or leashes at their previous home. We were eventually able to get collars on them, but they were and are still petrified of them. Soon after they arrived, we changed their names to Cuddles – appropriate because she loves to, and Goofus – because, well, he is!

Cuddles is a 4 ½ year old, 70 lb, dark rust, pure Golden Retriever and Goofus is her 2 ½ year old light coat, short haired mix. (Perhaps Lab or German Shepherd). When they arrived, they were afraid of anything and everything! The cowered, hid, and would not come to anyone at all. Newspapers, laundry baskets, cameras, people in hats, loud noises, leashes, and even new doggie beds scared them. They would not even wag their tails or smile or show any signs of happiness....very untypical for a Golden. There was no trust at all from them, and they were afraid to be near anyone. The would bolt out the door when we opened it into the yard, and were very hesitant to come back in. Goofus spent the first week or so hiding in the bathroom as soon as he came inside. Neither dog liked walking on our concrete patio, would only very hesitantly come into the house, would not walk up or down stairs, and did not seem to know what doggie treats were. They had very limited

7) commands...sit, lie down. They apparently had no experience with stairs, collars or leashes. They cowered whenever they would see a leash in our hands.

Well, here it is 3 months later. We have the two most beautiful adopted dogs in the world. Both dogs are very

well behaved. They are very people friendly, love to wag their tails as soon as they see us. They get up and greet us at the door, come readily for treats, praise or just to see what we're doing. They have mastered sit, lie down, wait, give paw, but they are still working on come. Cuddle will come willingly, Goofus needs a treat or two to encourage him. Doggie treats have been a favorite since they were introduced to them.

Cuddles likes the couch much more than her doggie bed and will sneak up onto it to cuddle with us, even though she knows we are watching. Goofus is not sure yet if his hind feet can leave the floor. He loves to go out and chase away the squirrels. Both are great at protecting their house and make sure that all the visiting animals know it's theirs.

We still have a long road ahead of us. Leashes remain a major fear. It will still take them a while to realize that the leash will not hurt them. Steps will take a bit more time...but they are both working on them.

They have full acclimated to us, our home, our yard. They are a delight, a joy, and many times a good laugh, especially when Goofus tried to lean from the floor all the way up 6 stairs to get a treat, planted his front feet on each step, but accidentaly stepped off his hind feet and when he realized he was off the floor, did a full body turn in the air to get back down. We thank Goldheart for introducing us to two wonderful dogs who are now part of our family.

He stood there and watched Ginger swim after half hour he started to wade a little and that

On September 3, 2014, **Cody (GH726)** passed over the Rainbow Bridge. He was our long term foster for just over 3 years. I picked Cody up from his one and only family in 2011. He was well loved but his family was in financial hardship and had to leave their apartment. They made the devastating decision to give up then 11 year old Cody to the rescue.

Cody was consistently kind, reliable and supremely gentle – in other words, the quintessential Golden Retriever. Everyone, both 2 legged and 4 was greeted with good will. He was a joy to have for 3 precious years and he completed our triumvirate of Goldens.

Although basically a healthy senior dog, his hips were in

poor shape. But with supplements, pain meds and consistent, gentle walks, he kept moving and enjoyed a good quality of life. We were very fortunate that he got to travel to FL with us to spend the winter of 2014. Although he didn't join us on the beach each day, it was too hard for him to move through the sand, we got to walk every morning and evening all winter in the gentle climate and flat terrain. What a trip it was with 3 goldens and 2 dog beds down to FL and back.

Although I could see Cody aging and I knew 13 ½ was a great age for a golden, I never expected it to end so quickly. He suffered a major vestibular event at the end of our evening walk on September 2<sup>nd</sup>. He had a total loss of balance. We did leave him at the vet's office so they could try a series of drugs that are sometimes helpful, but at the end of the day, he still could not even sit up. The vet explained it as a feeling of being constantly seasick on an ever spinning top. The only option was to relieve his suffering. We had the time with him to thank him for being a part of our home and our lives. We were with him as he passed over the bridge. He was the dearest of all Golden boys and it was our joy and privilege to be a part of his life for a few precious years.....Bill and Tamara Webb

The day I met him he put my entire hand in his mouth. He didn't bite down, but he wanted to make sure we would take him home. I'm so glad we did, because once he let go of my hand, he held on to my whole heart. He had the most beautiful and expressive eyes, and the most ferocious bark of any dog I've heard. If you heard it and didn't know him you would definitely be afraid. But his bark simply matched the size of his heart. He wasn't a typical Golden in that he would not chase or fetch anything you threw. He would just look at you as if he thought it was the dumbest game ever invented. I simply have to remember the everyday smiles brought about by the love of, and for our companions are enough to endure the heartache, past present and future...
