If you would like to try your hand at fostering or have a family member or friend who would like to know about it, please let any of the board members know. We also need folks to just take a foster dog for a week-end, if the current foster family has an emergency or while the foster family goes on vacation. If we have to put the foster dogs in a kennel the costs can add up. This will help GoldHeart save a lot of money.

Last, as you know, all the GoldHeart dogs are micro-chipped. These pups always stay registered to GoldHeart, if someone gets out and lost GoldHeart will be notified. We encourage all adopting families to contact AVID and register with them as a contact for your dog. Recently someone found a GoldHeart dog that had gotten out and when they called AVID he was only registered to us. I was not home to check the spread sheet with all the registered chips and intake numbers. Fortunately the owners were found right away. Please put yourselves on as an alternate contact so you can be found right away when your golden loses you.

As you know, we never have enough foster homes. We have been lucky enough to not have turned any dogs away because some of our foster homes are willing to take on more than one foster at a time. This has been a blessing. Some foster homes get tied up with one foster who needs a lot of medical care and therefore are not able to take on another foster.

I am asking everyone and anyone who is already on our foster home list to let the intake coordinator Carol Ruell know that you want to remain on the foster home list or to please remove you from the list. Even if you could only do an emergency foster for a day or so, this helps us avoid putting that incoming dog in a kennel situation which costs the rescue money. Some families that are on the list never respond and that's okay. We just don't want to bother you with the emails.

I am asking the members at this point to specify what they would be interested in doing, fostering, emergency foster (1 or 2 days), volunteering for events, transports, home visits, dog sitting for a foster home who is going away.

In late March of 2015 GoldHeart was notified about a litter of 6 puppies in a high kill shelter in South Carolina. 5 little boys and a little girl. Even though they were mixes they were just babies and the board decided they needed a new "leash" on life. No other rescue would commit to taking them because they were "too mixy" and very sick puppies.

One of our members Mr. Bob Topper volunteered to go to the shelter and get them. He drove all night to be there when the shelter opened. Unfortunately the little girl could not hang on until we got them pulled.

The boys became known as the South Carolina 5. All were scared and very sick. We took them to the vet and everyone had demodex mange, sarcoptic mange, parasites and kennel cough. All were very underweight. The vet said he could not guarantee they would make it through the week-end. They needed lots of medicated baths, lots of good food and very much needed - a lot of TLC. Our foster homes provided all of that.

Until we got to know them a little better they were just Puppies 1-5. Then they got their names:




