A LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

As we find the holidays behind us and for my family a rough 2017, we are very much looking forward to 2018.

GoldHeart continues to get calls about golden's needing to be surrendered, whether owner give up, stray or unwanted. Sometimes it seems to be nonstop. Without our foster homes and volunteers to pick up these dogs and get them where they need to be we would not be able to continue with our goal of "No Golden Left Behind".

As you know GoldHeart has been doing a lot of international transports. Why? You may ask. What about the dogs here in this country? Let me assure you that GoldHeart checks into every golden that is reported to us that is sitting in a shelter here in the US. It is rare anymore that the shelters here will turn a dog over to us, especially if it is a young dog that is considered highly adoptable. If the golden is a "problem child" (bite history, senior with a lot of medical issues, doesn't get along with other dogs) they are more than willing to turn them over to us.

The dogs coming in from Egypt are so grateful to finally know a family and love. Most of the dogs end up as strays because families just toss them to the streets when they are no longer wanted. On the streets they may be hit by cars, shot or poisoned by the police to control their populations even tortured by young children, yes young children.

When our contacts in Egypt get ahold of us, they send pictures and as much history as they can. We take a board vote and notify them whether we can or cannot take the dog. When we vote to take the dog in, the dogs are vetted in Egypt and then quarantined for 30 days there before entering the US then the funds are raised to bring them here. No current GoldHeart dogs or any dogs needing to come into GoldHeart is turned away here in the US to make room for an international dog. Please find it in your hearts to foster these grateful and precious dogs. You will get unconditional love.

Fostering is a very rewarding experience. My husband and I have made very good friends through fostering and meeting the folks that are adopting our foster. We end up with long lasting friendships with a lot of our adopters. I used to babysit 2 dogs adopted from me until the family moved to Florida 3 years ago. This year in Oct. we finally got a chance to go to their home for a visit. When we arrived it took about 10 seconds for the girls to remember us, now remember it's been 3 years since we saw them. We were overnight guests and we ended up having to let the girls sleep with my husband and I because they just would not settle down. They slept all night in our bedroom and woke the next morning just as happy to see us and they were the day before when we arrived.

We have two families that we have had a wonderful friendship with for 8 and 10 years. Please, if you would like to try fostering or know of anyone who would be a great foster family please have them fill out an application.

Photos with Santa was a great success this year. We would like to thank the staff of Baron's K9 Country store for making sure it happened this year and they were afraid they could not do it. They found a spot for us and it was wonderful. We made a little over \$600. Lots of pups came through to tell Santa how good they were. Thank you to everyone who took time out of your busy schedules to do this events.

We also did gift wrapping at Barnes and Noble in White Marsh. The grand total for 2 days of gift wrapping was around \$773. Again, thank you for everyone who donated time to do this event.

Another big fundraiser is coming up. That is the Pet Expo in Timonium. The dates for that are Jan. $26^{th}27^{th}$ and 28^{th} . This is a great event with a lot of venders, rescues and exhibits. It takes quite a few volunteers to run this event. Please contact me, Barb Schaefer at <u>president@goldheart.org</u> if you can set aside a few hours of your time to volunteer. Well behaved dogs are always welcome at this event.

Happy Endings

Here is our story about our 2 Golden Rescues-GH #896 was Lilly, now Cuddles (darker Golden), and GH#897 was Porky, now Goofus (lighter 1/2 Golden and we don't have any idea what the other half is-although he has a curled tail, is lean and lanky and runs like the wind). When we went to get them from their previous owner they were scared, very apprehensive, and difficult to catch in their yard. They had never had a collar or leash. Even food treats did not work; however, we eventually were able to get them into our vehicle. We put new collars on them, and had leashes for them. They were petrified of the leashes and cowered at the sight of them.



We received them, mother and son on August 3, 2014. They were scared of EVERYTHING and EVERYONE. Cuddles was about 4 or 5-we had no records from the previous owner. Goofus was 2. When we went to pick them up, we asked about Veterinarian visits, vaccines, etc. The only thing we were told was that they had a veterinarian in Hagerstown, MD. After I called around, I found that that veterinarian had seen Cuddles after giving birth to 10 puppies. We had a date for their birth (4/12/2012); Goofus was the only puppy they kept. That was the only time Cuddles had seen a veterinarian. Her birthdate was listed as Either 12/4/2009 or 11/14/2010.

They rode home very quietly and slept in the back of our SUV, not even rousing during a horrendous thunderstorm on the way home! Once home, they would not get out of the back of the vehicle! After lifting them out, we brought them into our housealready ready with blankets, beds and food dishes and toys. They both ran into our downstairs bathroom and shook. We figured that they had been kept in a laundry room or something off the kitchen area and not allowed anywhere else. They would only come and go out our patio doors, refused to go out through the garage door or upstairs. Once out in the back fenced yard they would cower in the far corner of the yard, and we had to attempt to get a leash on them to get them back inside our house.

Eventually, we had a dog behavior specialist come to see them. Within 5 minutes of being with them, she mentioned that she thought they had been abused and hit by any means. She suggested we immediately change their names to something sounding completely different. Thus Lilly became Cuddles-and her name fits her personality because she does now enjoy cuddling, brushing, and being petted. Porky became Goofus-his name fits because he is and does goofy things-like eats grass and dirt, runs like a gazelle and will bark at anything moving –whether cars on the road, kids playing next door, squirrels on the tree branches, deer out in the woods behind our house, or stray cats beyond the fence. He is a terrific guard dog and no one or nothing can come within eyesight without him alerting us that something is moving!! When anyone comes to the house or yard, he runs to the fence or door and goes into "guard dog mode". Strangers think twice about coming in when they see him.

After almost 3 ½ years of patience, lots of treats and attention, they have both become wonderful family members. They greet us when we come home, they love to chase the balls we throw (and the occasional squirrel who forgets that there are 4 legged inhabitants that live here now). Goofus is still afraid of some things, but he is getting better. Cuddles will offer her paw when she wants to be petted or brushed. Goofus will just come over and sit and stick his head in our laps. They have made our home their home and we see tremendous progress in the time we have had them.
