Sofie has required veterinary care totaling over \$14,000, and we are pleased to report she recently took her first steps! Benny our sweet tripod, who just found his forever home, incurred vet expenses over \$5,000. Gracie was near death due to multiple tick-borne diseases and was saved by the emergency Vets at University of Penn, with charges reaching close to \$5,000. Ash's vetting has already reached \$1,500 and with severe hip dysplasia, thousands more may be needed to ensure this sweet boy lives a life without pain. Brittany, one of our latest arrivals, will require knee surgery due to a torn cranial cruciate ligament, and the cost of surgery with aquatic physical therapy could reach \$4,000. Many other wonderful goldens and golden-mixes have required routine vetting, and surgeries for mass removals, dental cleaning, extractions, along with spay and neuter surgeries, with

cost per dog often exceeding \$1,000.

GoldHeart's Non-Refundable Adoption Application Fee Increasing to \$30.00

Effective January 1, 2017, the non-refundable application fee for new adopters, foster homes, and foster-to-adopt homes, will increase from \$25.00 to \$30.00. As an all-volunteer non-profit 501(c)3 organization, application fees collected support our rescue efforts and help to defer a portion of the costs incurred when bringing dogs into rescue (e.g., transport, vetting, fostering).

As part of this increase each approved applicant will now automatically be granted a complimentary membership for the calendar year they are approved; and for those applicants approved during October - December of the calendar year, the applicant will receive a complimentary membership through the following calendar year.

Dog Gone Great - Sam the Bomb Sniffing Dog!

My name is Joe Dolan and I'm a Sergeant in the Metropolitan Police Department's Bomb Squad in Washington, DC. Let me tell you about a great Golden Retriever named Sam. it all started in the Summer of 2010. My wife, Amy and I very unexpectedly lost our Bomb Dog, Elvis. Elvis was only 6 years old and we loved him. After this loss, I asked Amy to find a Golden Retriever Rescue as I deeply wanted my next Bomb Dog to be a rescue. (My first Bomb Dog, Fred, was a Golden Retriever rescue and he was a wonderful working dog. He had a long life, he officially retired from the police department and lived with us until he passed away at the age of 14.) Amy found Gold Heart Golden Retriever Rescue online and applied. We saw a picture of Sam with his description. He was 6 months old and had come from an abusive background and was very high energy. As soon as I saw the picture of Sam I knew I wanted to train him to be my next Bomb Dog. I was looking for a partner with a big heart and a willingness to take on a big job.

In August of 2010, Barb and Bill Schaefer (wonderful people) brought Sam to our home in Maryland. Sam and I attended a 14 week explosive detection school, where Sam is taught to locate all types of explosives by using his awesome nose. I trust my life to Sam's ability to locate explosive devices. People often think that Sam works by himself and that he is in harm's way by himself but that is just not the case. We are always together on calls for service, so whatever comes about no matter what it involves we are joined at the hip from start to finish. We spend countless hours training. I teach Sam search patterns and a gentle response when he locates an explosive device without touching it. When Sam identifies an explosive he is trained to just sit. Sam and I have

handled thousands of calls for service in Metropolitan DC from bomb calls of every variety to suspicious packages to sweeps before major events. For example, before the last Presidential Inauguration it was Sam that swept all areas of the parade route. Speaking of President's, Sam also rides in the Presidential motorcades to ensure that the routes are always clear of suspicious items. You can imagine what a huge job that is and it comes with a lot of responsibility. And Sam gets it done – every time.

It is such a gratifying feeling to have Sam as my partner. He lives at home with me, Amy, our twin daughters, Ashlyn and Avery, and our three Yorkies – Henry, Chloe and George. Sam is truly a part of our family. I sincerely thank Gold Heart for rescuing Sam from a bad situation so that he could reach his full potential with me. He is the greatest partner a man could ask for and when Sam reaches his retirement he will live with us for the rest of his life. I truly love Sam. If you ever want a dog the greatest thing you can do is rescue one, they will love you for life.

If only love could have saved you Seamus, we would never have lost you.



It is with great sadness that I am writing about my Buddy's death. He was approximately 16 years old and we adopted him from the Plate Family at the approximate age of 3 years old. Shaaron told me that he had "high energy". I responded by telling her that since he was young, that was a good thing. She raised an eyebrow and said nothing. Shaaron Plate saw that I could handle such a dog since I brought my Amber to her home that day who was 14 at the time. I soon learned the true meaning of "high energy" after he pulled me out the door and I ended up with Tendonitis in my left shoulder.


Others might have given him up for less but I knew that it was an accident. I then not only took Buddy to Obedience classes and worked with him at home, but went to Physical Therapy several



times a week as well. My Tendonitis disappeared never to return again and Buddy improved greatly over a bit of time well spent! I had been told that he was found running the streets of Baltimore City. Developing "High Energy" must have meant survival for him! I never worked so hard with a dog before but the benefits outweighed the efforts. I felt like I trained a "stallion". After a while, he became a "Certified Therapy Dog' and went to various facilities including the Futurecare Cherrywood Nursing Home and the Guilchrist Hospice. Having him, encouraged me to take an extensive course and get Hospice Certification.As I write this, I am getting chills. He was never aggressive and was quite a survivor for such a long time. I used to call him "Super Dog", among other nicknames. He not only survived the streets of Baltimore but he also survived Oral Cancer, and a Lacerated eye, which a Canine Opthomologist said was probably not an accident. She informed me that some old dogs develop this condition.At one point, he had Vertigo too. I knew that one day, his survival would end. He passed away in our home on Wednesday, August 10th, 2016. Life will never be the same without our Buddy!

If it wasn't for the fact that we adopted Buddy from Goldheart, I wouldn't have had this dog. Shortly after, adopting Buddy, we went to the annual Goldheart picnic where Marie Sciscone was talking about Goldstock and had an album of pictures. I have never heard of the Goldstock Camp and it sounded wonderful. After our Amber died (she was 3 months past 15) I wanted another dog in memory of this sweet dog. We went to Goldstock and I met some one from the Pa. Rescue who found me my very mellow, sweet and wonderful Chloe. We

attached on the middle name of Amber. She was our "Memorial Dog"! She came to us and added a wonderful new dimension to our lives. She was my first Therapy pet and made so many people happier during her years of service. Unfortunately, she developed an inflamation on her Larynx and most of her voice disappeared. People used to tell me that she needed water, she was tired, etc. when they heard her very frequent panting. She couldn't help herself. This condition destroyed her Immune System and she died on Monday, June 27th, 2016. This was a bit difficult to write but seems necessary. She and Buddy are missed more than words are capable of expression!

MACK (GH714)

My name is Greg Corrigan. A few years ago I thought I might be able to do some good by offering my services to be a short term foster parent for a dog needing a home. When I was asked to go to Ellicott City, MD to pick up a 5 year old golden-doodle mix whose family could no longer keep him, I had no idea what the future would be. I brought Mack home. I live in a barn in Kennett Square, PA. He refused to get out of the car for 6 hours. It took me days to teach him to walk OFF the leash. (we have 27 acres here!)

But it wasn't long before Mack opened up his heart and fell in love with this place, and me, and everyone I know. He is truly the most wonderful dog I have ever known.

Mack died in my arms on July 2 after a relatively short illness. As he was dying, he was still happy to be held. I told him how much I loved him and how grateful I was for all the goodness he brought into my life. I miss him terribly. In his honor, I took boxes of tennis



balls and left them at dog parks in the area with Mack's picture on and an explanation of why this gift was being left in his honor.

Thank you GoldHeart for the "golden" treasure that remains in my heart...Mack is a joy that will remain a forever blessing to me.
