A LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

WHO WILL CARE FOR YOUR DOG?

GoldHeart has taken in a lot of lost, stray and owner surrenders this year. Each and every dog has a story that could reduce you to tears and has, but the saddest stories of all are the goldens whose owner has passed away and made no provisions for that beloved pet.

All of our adopters know and I am hoping they remember to tell family members that when an owner passes away that golden is to be returned to the GoldHeart family. Please remember to put that in writing somewhere (keep it with your will) and make sure your family knows that. Your family may request to adopt that golden and that has been done in the past. We certainly don't want to take that golden from family members. In the event that no one wants the golden he/she will be brought back into the rescue and placed in another foster home until a "forever home" can be found.

Please pass this advise on to friends and family who have pets of any kind whether they are GoldHeart Goldens or not. Don't just go on the assumption that family members will take care of your pets that you leave behind. It's usually those family members who will take your precious pet, put it in the car and take it to the shelter. There is nothing so devastating to a pet than to lose it's owner and then wind up in a shelter. Owner surrender dogs can be humanely euthanized immediately because there is no mandatory hold on them like a stray.

I personally have arrangements made with my family and have papers signed that my cousin will take my 2 if something happens to me or I will take her 2 if something happens to her.

I beg you to take a few minutes and think hard about what will happen to your dogs if you are no longer there. They are part of your family and you should have written instructions of where they should go and how they should be taken care of.

If you go to the GoldHeart home page, you will see "Planning for your beloved golden" Wills and Trusts. You can download the documents to make sure that in the event of your passing, your 4 legged family members will end up in the best hands possible. Please don't put it off any longer. Make sure your best friends are taken care of.

URGENT! URGENT! URGENT!

Hello Everyone:

This is Barbara Schaefer, President of GoldHeart Golden Retriever Rescue.

I wanted to bring some very important information your way and a reminder of everyone's adoption contract information.

As you all know, when you adopt a GoldHeart Golden, he or she has been completely vetted. Spayed/Neutered, up to date on all vaccines, tested for Lymes/Heartworm and treated for that if necessary. Vet bills are our biggest expense. We spent over \$45,000 last year.

You adoption contract states that you will keep your GoldHeart Golden up to date on vaccines and on monthly flea/tick and heartworm. It also states that you will have the golden tested yearly for heartworm. I know in today's economy sometimes we think that we can just skip it for awhile and start it up later when the money is not so tight.

We have had some GoldHeart goldens turned back in to the rescue for one reason or another and they have come in not up to date on their shots, ear infections, have not been on heartworm or flea/tick for months.

Heartworm is a very deadly disease and one that is very preventable. This year GoldHeart has already treated 2 goldens for heartworm. It is a very costly, painful procedure. We are being told by the vets that medication for Heartworm is becoming scarce and new cases coming in may not be able to be treated. This is very devastating news, especially for the goldens or any dog being infected with heartworm.

Please keep your GoldHeart golden and any other dog you may have up to date on their heartworm and have them tested yearly so they stay healthy and heartworm free. For any dog to die in today's world from heartworm is just negligence on the owner's part. Again, this is a very preventable disease with just a pill a month. It is not costly, but whatever the cost is, it is certainly worth your beloved family member's life.

Thank you for taking care of your GoldHeart golden and providing a wonderful home for them.
