GoldHeart has welcomed its 500th rescue since our last news letter! Each Golden has their story. Maggie, GH-491, came from western Maryland, was in an outside pen and covered in hot spots and ticks, with breasts that were swollen. Yet in this desperate condition, we could clearly see that Maggie was a wonderful Golden full of love and compassion. This was further exhibited when we took Maggie to the vet, who then confirmed our suspicion that she was expecting. Not wanting to cause Maggie any further stress, we decided that we should allow her to complete the pregnancy. On Tuesday, August 12, 2008, Maggie gave birth to 11 Golden bundles (5 girls, and 6 boys). All of whom were and remain healthy and safe! GoldHeart could not have accomplished this without several things: wonderful dedicated volunteers from intake, transport, and whelping. GoldHeart owes undying gratitude to our vice-president Barb Schaefer and her hubby Bill for

her agreeing to take Maggie in to see her through her pregnancy and the birth and adoption of her puppies.

In addition to volunteers, all activity along these lines also takes funding. Thanks to our generous members and the dedication of our volunteers who took the time and energy to manage our events tables, we are able to take on and manage all the expenses associated with the continuation of our mission. Without the funding, we could not accomplish a single happy ending for a Golden in need, including Maggie!

This year has seen many new firsts for GoldHeart, among these are events. We have participated successfully in the World of Pets Expo 2008, PawsAbilities, MD SPCA March for the Animals, and the Harford County Farm Fair. In addition, GoldHeart successfully sent Sarge through the HOPE program. Sarge has been in his new home for several months now, and a recent update from his new family reports he is

doing wonderfully. This in conjunction with the 1st Annual Bull Roast allows us the opportunity to do the work with Golden's we do. A special thanks to Donna Blake & Trish Thomas for all of their hard work on organizing the bullroast.

Your support as always, is just as important! And as you well know, your Golden tells you in any number of ways, from the wagging of his/her tail, to the joyous jumping when you enter the home to the barking at leaves, and the endless games of fetch. It takes endless commitment, dedication, and love to operate a rescue and GoldHeart has plenty of each. Thank you all!

Ripley, Our GoldHeart Girl

"That's one happy dog!" Mike and I must have said that every day about Ripley.

From her morning tail thumping greeting, through the day of happy dogwalks, car rides, and most of all dinnertime, Ripley loved life with us. She loved the routine of her new home and the new and exciting wildlife she watched through the windows. After a walk, she'd pounce on her menagerie of stuffed pookies, then roll over on her back and do her kick-boxing routine with her hind legs pumping away. Caught in the act, she'd just give us her goofy grin.

Ripley and I did home visits for GoldHeart and GRREAT and she loved them. As soon as she saw me pick up the clipboard, she was up and ready to go. She was expert at checking out the house, both indoors and outdoors and then sat down to let these new folks shower her with attention, nudging hands if they slowed down on the petting action. It was not unusual for the family to ask me to just leave Ripley with them.

Ripley especially enjoyed traveling with us. She traveled to the Smoky Mountains, Acadia National Park in Maine, the Delaware Water Gap and Rickett's Glen in Pennsylvania, and most recently, Blackwater Wildlife Refuge, Ocean City,

and Assateague Island. Hiking was her favorite activity she'd eagerly climb up the trails and pause at the top to enjoy the view. Long car rides didn't bother her and she was always on her best behavior for hotel stays.

Ripley lost her life to cancer in June, at the too young age of 10. The 4 ½ years she spent with us were far too short.

Of all the dogs we've shared our lives with, Ripley was the one who most closely bonded with us and meshed her life with ours. She loved both of us equally, sharing the daytime with me, and spending the evenings snuggled on the sofa with her head in Mike's lap. What we miss most is the sheer joy that she brought to our lives, but we take comfort in knowing that we were truly blessed to have been loved by her. Thank you, GoldHeart for all the wonderful work you do.



About GoldHeart

History

GoldHeart was started in 1999 by a small, dedicated group of volunteers with an undying love for Golden Retrievers. The initial group of volunteers were members of the Golden Retriever Rescue Education, and Trainings (GRREAT), complementing GRREAT's efforts by concentrating GoldHeart's mission in the northern Maryland, south-central Pennsylvania and Delaware areas.

During the first five years of its existence, GoldHeart volunteers successfully placed nearly 300 Golden Retrievers in "forever homes," with this year promising to be our busiest year yet.

GoldHeart has grown to have over 200 members with an active group of 12 to 15 core volunteers who perform the bulk of the rescue efforts.

Mission

GoldHeart, Golden Retriever Rescue and its network of volunteers are dedicated to the rescue of unwanted, abused, neglected and displaced Golden Retrievers. We provide Goldens in need with a temporary safe haven in our foster homes where they receive love, food, grooming, medical treatment, and some training. During this time their temperament is evaluated to determine the best home for their personalities, and ultimately they are relocated to loving adoptive "forever" homes.

GoldHeart volunteers work to foster a public sentiment of humanity and gentleness toward Golden Retrievers and all other animals. They encourage and promote responsible pet ownership, do all within their power to reduce the pet overpopulation and will work to encourage humane treatment and care of animals through education and spay/neuter advocacy.
