### WINTER 2011



In Nov 2003 I filled out an application with GoldHeart to foster a golden. I knew that my experience as a loving dog owner, groomer and pet sitter would help me out.

As we anxiously waited for our home visit and approval to come through, I thought "WOW" I could probably adopt a child faster than this.

After what seemed to be forever, our approval came through along with a call about my very first foster. His name was Simba and he had been tied to a doghouse for 4 years. I waited for the volunteer to bring him. What a beautiful boy he was. Of course, not housebroken but with the other dogs here that went well and he learned quickly. Simba was adopted out in our own neighborhood so we got to see him often.

Simba was our first success and it just went on from there. Hence the joy of fostering.

Many, many foster dogs later (about 58) Bill and I are still fostering. Some fit in very well and others just managed to get along. Most are in wonderful homes now. Some we even get to see on a regular basis. The joys.

Some have been real challenges and brought tears and joy. Maggie and her 11 puppies. From emergency surgery to round the clock feedings. 3 years later Maggie is in a fantastic home and so are the puppies. The tears and the joy of fostering.

In October of 2009 we took in Maggie GH# 599 and Makai GH# 600. A 10 year old brother and sister whose owner passed away. Very obese and barely able to move, we took them in knowing we would probably never get them adopted out. We worked on their weight and took walks around the yard and neighborhood. The weight came off and they were doing great. Makai started out at 167 pounds and Maggie was 145. Maggie got down to 118 pounds and Makai was down to 102. They could run through the yard and finally do the steps. One day a lady came that was interested in both and it seemed like it was going to happen. Maggie had an appointment at the vets the next day to have a lump checked and unfortunately it was cancer. We decided we could not separate them so they would remain with Bill and I. We lost our Maggie in April 2010. Makai was lost without his sister. We lost Makai in July 2010 because of a very enlarged heart and a tumor at the base of the heart. Here you have the many, many tears side of fostering..

In Nov 2009, Black Friday to be exact, Mr. Archie GH# 611 arrived. 13 weeks old and a ball of fuzz and a bundle of energy. No one bothered to tell Archie he is a sick little boy.

Archie was diagnosed with a Grade 6 heart murmur. After raising funds for surgery we found that Archie has a rare heart defect that is causing the heart murmur and no surgery will correct his problem. The tears again.

At around 7 months of age it was a board decision to make Archie a Long Term Foster and allow him to remain with Bill and me. This was a wonderful day for me because I found myself in love with this little guy. He fits in well with his foster brother and sister.

So again we have the joys of fostering. The joy of fostering.

On Nov 2, 2010 we got an e-mail about Toby. A beautiful 2 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> year old who was in renal failure and the owners could not afford to treat him. Toby was immediately made a Long Term Foster because of his health and the fact that he could not be neutered. Toby was given the best treatment thanks to the kindness of members and strangers who heard about his illness. Toby lived with Bill and I and our golden gang for a little more than 2 months and made a big impact on our family. He loved his ball and he loved Bill. He stole Bills heart. On Jan. 14, 2011 we decided it was time to let Toby cross over that Rainbow Bridge where his spirit could be free from illness and he could be healthy and strong. What a heartbreaking day for Bill and I. Again, the tears of fostering.

Fostering has been a wonderful and rewarding experience for us. Yes, some are a real challenge and others are absolutely wonderful from the minute they walk through your door and look to you for that TLC and reassurance that they are going to be okay.
